The South Florida Irish Film Festival (SFIFF) is an annual event jointly sponsored by the Halmos College of Arts and Sciences, the Alvin Sherman Library and Research Center, and the South Florida Irish Studies Consortium. SFIFF has been a consistent feature on NSU's annual calendar of events since 2007. Every November SFIFF presents a collection of independent Irish films that showcase the work of both established and emerging Irish filmmakers. SFIFF Director, Dr. David Kilroy, works with the Irish Film Institute in Dublin, Ireland, to identify the line-up of films for each years' festival. A mix of documentaries and feature length films, the annual selections for SFIFF are chosen with the view to highlighting cultural, historical, and political issues of moment in contemporary Ireland.

Internship Objective

The goal of South Florida Irish Film Festival is promote contemporary Irish film to a broad audience in South Florida. The film festival is co-sponsored by NSU's Halmos College of Arts and Sciences, the Alvin Sherman Library, and the South Florida Consortium for Irish Studies. The South Florida Irish Film Festival also works with the Irish Film Institute in Dublin, Ireland, to identify films and secure rights for screening. As part of the requirement for the Internship course the student will be assigned readings and do some guided research on Irish film in order to be prepared to serve the mission of the festival. The student will work with all of the stakeholders and partners involved in the film festival on various aspects of development and promotion of the festival and work with the festival director in choosing the films to be screened and identifying target audiences for specific films. The intern will also conduct research on the films, addressing areas such as cast and crew, reviews, historical and cultural context, etc., which they will then use to design and develop a program that will be distributed to the audience at the festival.

Duties or Tasks Performed

- Meet weekly with the South Florida Irish Film Festival director.

- Research material on films to be screened.
