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Hybrid Course Information Guide

CARM/D 6660 Conflict Management in Groups: Overt and Covert Dynamics - Dr. Neil Katz

The purpose of this unique course is to provide participants with knowledge skills and attitudes to be effective in groups with an emphasis on analyzing and managing a variety of tasks in different settings. The course examines issues of communication, leadership, power and authority in relation to group and interpersonal effectiveness and enables participants to better understand and cope with complex challenges as they emerge in the natural life of groups and organizations. Insights into overt and covert dynamics are generated through direct experience in a temporary living laboratory where members can experience and explore group life as it occurs. A team of approximately 6 trained and experienced faculty and consultants manage the event.

Mandatory attendance at the Davie campus is required for 3 days for the residential part of the hybrid course (Saturday-Monday Feb. 3-5). For participants expecting graduate school credit, limited participation on Canvas Discussion Board will continue throughout the term. If zoom sessions are requested, they will be offered on a voluntary basis.
