Dr. Sara Cobb, Ph.D., is Professor Emerita at the Jimmy and Rosalynn Carter School for Peace and Conflict Resolution at George Mason University, where she was also the Director for 8 years. She teaches and conducts research on the relationship between narrative and violent conflicts; she is also the Director of the Center for the Study of Narrative and Conflict Resolution at the Carter School that provides a hub for scholarship on narrative approaches to conflict analysis and resolution. Formerly, she was the Director of the Program on Negotiation at Harvard Law School and has held positions at a variety of tier one research institutions such as University

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of California, Santa Barbara, University of Connecticut, and more recently at the University of Amsterdam. She has also consulted to and/or conducted training for a host of public and private organizations, including UN High Commission on Refugees, UNDP, La Caxia Bank, and Exxon, the American Bar Association, Fox learning Academy as well as a number of universities in Europe and Latin America.

Practicum Advising Session: CARM/CARD 6180 – Internship in Training and Practice in Conflict Resolution 1:30pm

This internship course requires students to work with outstanding organizations, agencies, centers, for-profits, non-profit communities, governmental agencies, etc. to gain direct and applicable experiences in training and practice sites within the field. This course engages students to work within real world settings to help prepare them for careers and future employment in areas of training and practice in areas such as mediation, peacebuilding, negotiation, public policy, facilitation, social movements, dispute systems design, arbitration, and other conflict resolution activities.

It enables students to translate theory and research into meaningful impacts in their sites aimed at conflict prevention, conflict management, conflict resolution, conflict transformation, peacebuilding, and social change. Students will develop invaluable skills and abilities within their sites while simultaneously contributing to their sites by applying their theoretical knowledge. Students may work with established partnerships of our department, or they may seek approval for a new site if it meets the criteria and standards of the department in advance of the course.

Lynn Cole, who is the Past President of Mediators Beyond Borders will be a guest speaker. She will share stories in her career and the work she has done in building a successful mediation firm that delivers domestic and international conflict resolution training programs.

David Noganosh also will share stories about his journey of self-determination, his work with Aboriginal and African Canadian Communities, empowerment, and rebuilding relationships. The session will be open to discussion at the end of the presentation.



Lynn Cole is an experienced dispute resolution professional with experience in all aspects of ADR, including mediation and arbitration and mediation system-design in four developing Rule of Law countries. As a Harvard-trained and Florida-certified mediator, she also has served as a Special Master, an SEC receiver, a Neutral Evaluator, A Special Magistrate, and Settlement Council. She has served internationally in Bulgaria, Jordon, Kosovo, and Sri Lanka as an ADR and Mediation Specialist with USAID and teached internationally. Ms. Cole is the President and CEO of BRDGES Academy, an online educational platform for training dispute resolution practitioners. Mediators Beyond Borders International, Founding Member; President, and sits on the Board of Directors.

David Noganosh is his English name and spirit name is Spotted Hawk. He is a Mediator, Negotiator, and Trainer from Anissinabek Nation, Wolf Clan. He is the Principal and Founder of Red Wolf Mediation, a company he founded in 2012, and it is the only First Nations-owned and operated Mediation Firm in Ontario, Canada. He has actively facilitated violence prevention, conflict resolution, and anger management programs in Aboriginal and African Canadian communities for many years. He joined St. Stephen's Conflict Resolution & Training in 2008, where he was an Associate Mediator and Trainer until 2013.
